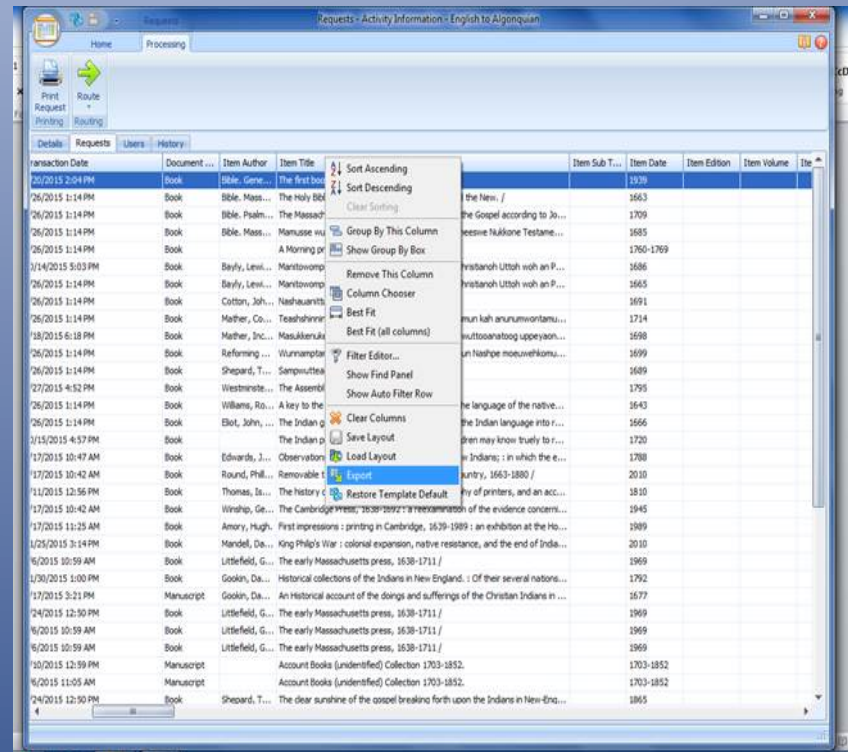
# Exporting Metadata

	From Content DM	From Aeon	From General Catalog that allows MARC Export
Why?	For item level headings of graphic arts materials	Detailed records, but lack subject headings	Detailed records, including subject headings
How?	Varies Depends on Content DM you are using	See next 2 slides	<a href="#">See AAS pastispresent.org post on how to use MardEdit</a> to convert from MARC to CSV

END GOAL: CSV FILE (from Excel)

# From Aeon to CSV

1. create an event for your exhibition in Aeon
2. Add items to your event
3. On the event page in Aeon, right click on column headings and export to excel
4. Be sure to save as a CSV

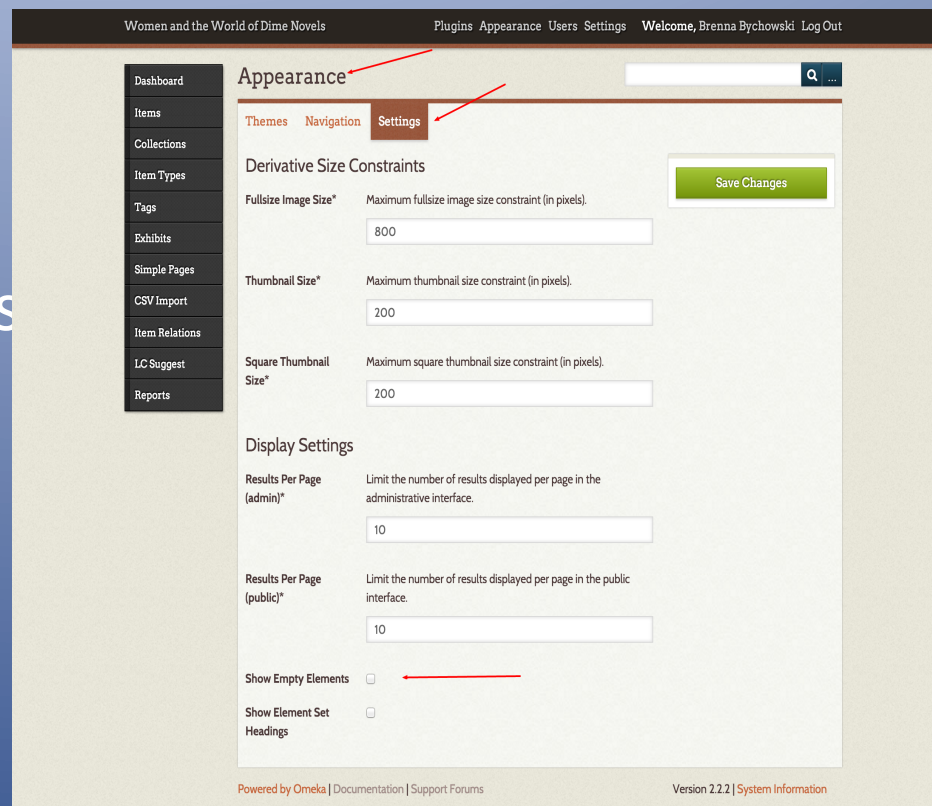

## CSV Import Plug-In

- Prepare CSV for import
  - Save as CSV (not .xls)
  - From Catalog: Need to change column headings from MARC tags to unique words
  - All cells must be filled
  - Get rid of additional punctuation
    - Possible use of “Text to Columns”
- Map Columns to Elements

# Dublin Core

- If all CSV fields are not filled, then won't show up; you might therefore have to fill in some fields w nonsense data and then erase it once imported
- Settings to
  - Appearance to
    - Unclick “show empty elements”



# Hide Elements Plug-in

- Elements can separately be hidden from the edit form, display on the admin side, display on the public side, and the search form.
- Plugins to
  - hide elements to
    - configure
